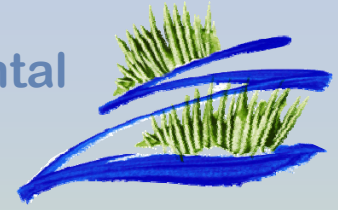

Keep in mind:

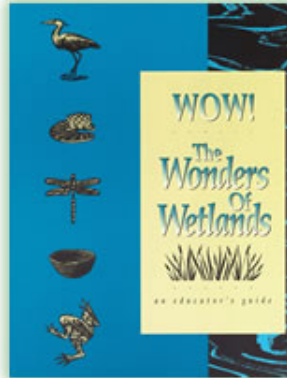
- A minimum of 12 paying participants is required per workshop.

WOW! The Wonders of Wetlands

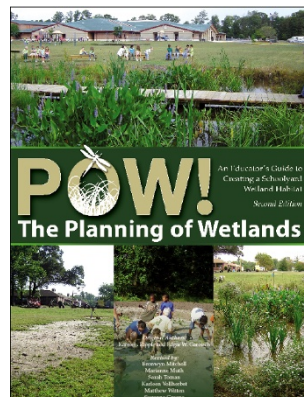
